Military Status

Lieutenant in the Royal Regiment of Canada.

Circumstances of death

Killed after D-Day while fighting Germans, he was 25 years old.

He was killed after liberating the town of Cardebugle, along with six other men in his unit.

Burial site

Bretville-sur-laize, Canadian war cemetery located in Calvados, France.

He was buried where he had fallen dead



At first Rupert enlisted in the air force, however he couldn't fly. He came back and became a troop instead.

Born: August 28th, 1918 in Aldershot, United Kingdom

Date of death: August 24th (in town of Cardebugle.

Rank: Lieutenant

Prior to his life in the war, he attended the Shield and Westmount. He worked at the bank of Point St. Charles, after working for many different branches, he enlisted in August 1940 to the Royal Canadian Air Force.
